#### FCC Reinstates Form 395-B



Last Thursday, the FCC released <u>an Order</u> reinstating the requirement for radio and television broadcasters to annually file an <u>FCC Form 395-B</u>. Station groups with 5 or more full-time employees would need to classify all full and part time station employees by race or ethnicity, gender and the type of job they perform.

A version of this form had been used by the FCC in the '80s and '90s, but its use was put on hold in 1998 as the result of Court decisions. The Court found unconstitutional the FCC's use of this information to impose regulatory burdens on broadcasters whose employment profile did not reflect the demographics of its service area. The Court's belief was that these additional regulatory actions forced broadcasters to make hiring decisions based on race or gender, which is a form of prohibited discrimination. The VAB's Intern Subsidy Program, designed to connect stations who need workforce help with students interested in Broadcasting, is accepting applications now for internship subsidies.

To qualify, the intern must be a college student or a trade school student enrolled in a program pertaining to the communications, broadcast media, marketing or engineering industry.

### 2024 Alternative Broadcast Inspection Program



In 2024, the VAB is once again offering the Alternative Broadcast Inspection Program (ABIP) to help stations ensure they are in compliance with FCC regulations. Stations that pass an alternative broadcast inspection get a Certificate of Compliance, which prevents the FCC Enforcement Bureau from showing up at your station to do an unannounced technical inspection for three years. 100% of the \$500 inspection cost is paid by the VAB as a member benefit!

The Vermont ABIP inspection work is performed by Spectrum Investigative Services, formerly owned by Bob Shotwell and now by Vermonters Chip Morgan and Maria Slattery. They will work directly with stations to schedule inspections at a convenient time. As a reminder, any non-compliance issues found during an inspection are confidential. Stations are given an opportunity to cure them to earn their

certificate, but if a station opts not to cure, that too remains confidential, so there is no risk to having an inspection done. The VAB encourages all stations to utilize this important member benefit! Get started now by downloading, completing and emailing the agreement to vab@vab.org today!
